



Build Capacity - EPA Heat Island Website: www.epa.gov/heatisland

- Main website for UHI information
- Revamp through Spring 2008
- Group information into
 5 basic categories (currently
 15)
- Add current information and relevant links on relevant pages
- Provide overview then link to more detailed downloadable file
- Revamp UHI conference call/webcast page so that subject matter is upfront vs. date of event



Turn Research into Guidance: Urban Heat Island Guidebook/Compendium

- Recent change from "guidebook" to "compendium"
- Post chapters as they become available in conjunction with website revamp
- Focus on mitigation strategies
- Also material on UHI phenomenon, mitigation activities around the U.S., relationship with global climate change



Fill Gaps: Transportation Research Board (TRB) Subcommittee

- Growing local momentum and demand for guidance on pavement choices (roofing and urban forestry/green infrastructure data available, but what about pavement?)
 Most research has focused on solar reflectance
- Implementation considerations raise many issues -- need for broader and deeper approach
- Cambridge Systematics *Cool Pavement* report status of research and implementation activity
- June 2005 EPA Cool Pavement workshop

Fill Gaps: EPA Partnership with Arizona State University

• 2006 Partnership w/Arizona State University

- Transdisciplinary group researchers, gov't and industrial partners examining rapid urbanization impacts
- Extensive facilities for laboratory and field experiments
- Developing next generation of building and <u>paving</u> materials to reduce UHI impacts and address sustainability
- Materials Dbase w/thermal performance data
- Staffed call and email help center
- Education summer institute, executive education workshops, fellowships for grad students
- Holistic approach beyond 3 strategies

Fill Gaps: TRB AF000(2) – Paving Materials and the Urban Climate

Some Subcommittee Focus Areas:

- How pavement design and material selection contribute to surface and subsurface temperature fluctuations
- Thermal and radiative characterization of common paving materials
- Enhance pavements at the nanoscale.
- Pavement impacts beyond UHI

Some Subcommittee Activities:

- Advance the state of knowledge regarding technologies and practices to mitigate UHI impacts
- Address model and design practices, testing and standard development, technological approaches, and planning and policy considerations
- Provide a home for TRB related activities (sessions, workshops, reports, etc.)
