16. ABSTRACT

This Report to Congress on visibility is an assessment of actual progress and improvement in visibility conditions in mandatory Federal Class I areas. Under section 169 of the Clean Air Act (CAA; as amended in 1990), the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) must issue a report to Congress estimating the visibility improvement that could be expected in Class I areas due to implementation of the 1990 CAA Amendments. The EPA first issued this report in October 1993. The CAA also requires that every 5 years thereafter, EPA shall provide Congress with an assessment of actual progress and improvement in visibility in Class I areas in the form of a written report with copies to appropriate Congressional committees. This report is intended to satisfy that requirement and assesses visibility improvement over the period 1994-1998. Visibility conditions at forty-three monitor locations were calculated based on particulate matter concentrations for the period from 1994 through 1998. Visibility conditions showed statistically significant improvements at five sites on the least-impaired days and five sites on the most-impaired days. They also showed declines at three sites on the least-impaired days but no sites on the most-impaired days.
