



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
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A Solid Majority of Americans Thinks Global Warming Is Bad For the Health of People in the U.S.




On a scale from -3 (very bad) to +3 (very good), do you think global warming is bad or good for the <u>health</u> of Americans?

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
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
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Nearly One in Three Americans Thinks Global Warming Is Currently Harming the Health of People in the U.S. a "Great Deal" or "Moderate Amount"

The health of Americans is being/will be harmed a great deal/moderate amount...




The health of others in my household is being/will be harmed...





When asked in a <u>close-ended</u> question whether climate-related health conditions will increase or decrease over the coming decade, large numbers say they expect increases




Do you think each of the following will become more or less common in your community over the next 10 years <u>as</u> <u>a result of global warming</u> if nothing is done to address it?

Over a third say they anticipate increases in the number of heat strokes.







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




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An <u>open-ended</u> question reveals much less public understanding of climate-related health impacts

What health problems related to global warming are Americans experiencing? (Blue = correct response)




In your view, what health problems related to global warming are Americans experiencing, if any? [Open ended, multiple responses accepted, most common responses shown)





Over half are unable or unwilling to name a health effect of climate change




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


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


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Four percent cited temperature-related illnesses



In your view, what health problems related to global warming are Americans experiencing, if any? [Open ended, multiple responses accepted, most common responses shown)






Few Americans Are Aware of the Groups That Are More Vulnerable to Global Warming-Related Health Problems

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






The size of the bubbles shows the proportion of Americans that belonged to each group in Oct. 2014


Primary Differences between the Six Groups











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Majorities of the *Disengaged, Doubtful* and *Dismissive* say they don't want to hear about global warming

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





In the <u>close-ended</u> measures, close to 70% of the Alarmed said heat strokes will increase, but...



Economic & demographic characteristics associated with vulnerability are recognized by less than a quarter of any segment, including the *Alarmed*










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
Our health will suffer if we don't take action:

Global warming can harm people both directly and indirectly. Directly, global warming causes more extreme weather patterns including more frequent heat waves, more violent storms, and rising sea-levels – all of which can lead to people being harmed or killed. Indirectly, global warming harms the quality of our water, air and food, and our ecosystems, all of which can lead to increasing rates of disease and death. If we do not act now to limit global warming, experts at the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention say that global warming will harm people in every region of the United States. As a result of the poor air quality caused by global warming, children will become more likely to develop asthma, and the asthma they suffer from will be more severe; adults who have heart and lung diseases will become more likely to be hospitalized or die from their illness. An increasing number of extreme heat waves, floods, storms, fires and droughts caused by the changes in our climate will lead to more people being injured or killed.

Messages about health benefits of climate action were positively received across segments




Health framing elicited more hopeful feelings from *Cautious, Disengaged & Dismissive*



Conclusions

- Americans' understanding of the health impacts of climate change including the effects on heat-related illness is very shallow.
- Even the most concerned Americans (the *Alarmed*) show little understanding of the health effects of climate change.
- People who understand the health impacts of global warming are more likely to be taking action to protect themselves during extreme heat, and are more likely to support action by elected officials and public health agencies to protect the public.
- Medical professionals are well-positioned to increase people's understanding of the health effects of global warming.
- Framing global warming as a public health issue is likely to engage segments of the public that are skeptical about climate change or disengaged from the issue.
