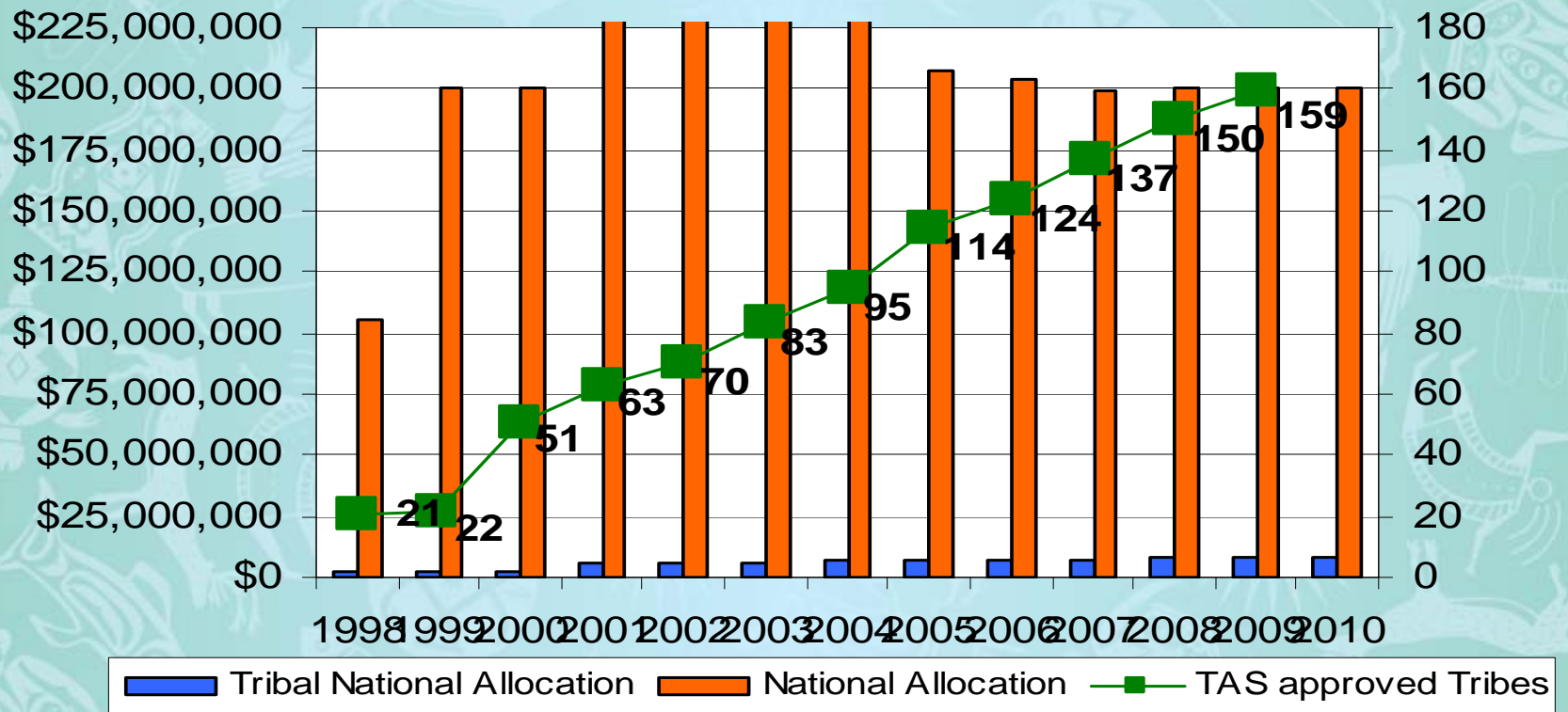

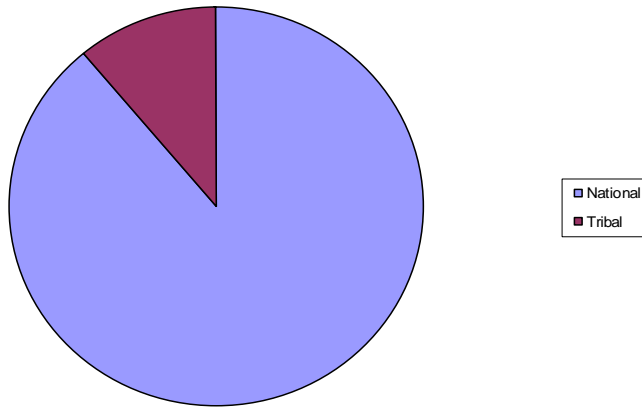

Section 319 National and Tribal Allocation of Funds and TAS Approval

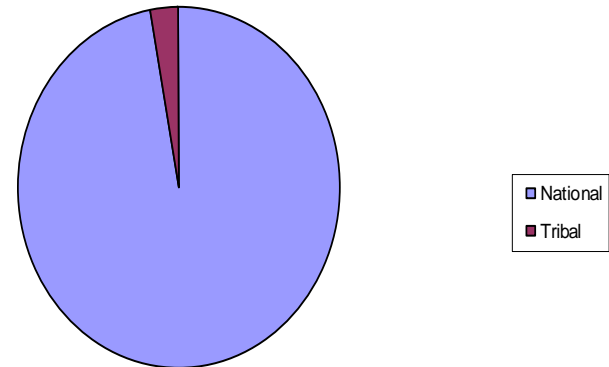


National Vs. Tribal 106 and 319 Grant Allocation (1998-2010)

Examples of Federal Programs

- ***Agricultural Conservation Programs***
 - implementation of agricultural management practices,
 - wetland restoration, land retirement,
 - protecting watersheds from damage caused by erosion, floodwater, and sediment;
 - restoring damaged watersheds;
 - conserving and developing water and land resources;
- ***Abandoned Mines Programs***

Examples of Federal Programs

- ***Federal Transportation Programs***
- ***Natural Resources***
 - USGS
 - physical processes and features such as soil and mineral resources,
 - surface and ground water resources,
 - topographic maps, and
 - water quality monitoring programs.
- ***Public Lands Management***
 - USFS, BLM, National Parks Service
- ***Threatened and Endangered Species Protection Programs***
 - USFWS, NOAA
 - Endangered Species Program Partners,
- ***Water Quantity Issues***
 - BOR
 - works with western states, American Indian tribes, and others to meet new water needs and balance the multitude of competing uses of water in the West.
- ***Wetland Protection Programs***
 - USACOE , USEPA
 - Section 404 of the Clean Water Act regulates the discharge of dredged or fill material into waters of the U.S., which include many types of wetlands.

Search the database:

Users may search the database in one of two ways: (1) by matching criteria with the funding program and (2) by matching words in the title of the funding program.

Jump to the [title search](#) if you are already familiar with a funding program or if you have a specific word that will probably be matched in the title (e.g., wetlands).

Criteria searches are based on:

1. The type of assistance you are interested in receiving (grants, loans, or both):

- Home
- How to Use this Site
- Complete List of All Programs
- Programs Listed by Keyword
- Programs Listed by Agency
- Administration ^ (requires login)
- Other Funding Sources

- Parks and recreation departments (open space)

- Planning and zoning programs (GIS mapping)
- Soil and water conservation districts (Ag)
- Cooperative extension (Ag)

Targeted Search:

The *Targeted Search* allows the user to search for resources using the following search criteria:

1. **Sponsor:** Who provides the funding program (Is it a federal, state or private program?).
2. **Eligible Applicant:** The type of organization you represent (Search results will identify only those funding programs for which your organization qualifies).
3. **Type of Assistance:** The type of assistance you are interested in receiving (grants, loans, technical assistance, etc).
4. **Match Requirement:** Whether or not you must provide matching funds to be eligible (includes cash and/or in-kind services).
5. **Topic Areas:** Topic areas that best relate to your project. Scroll your mouse over each topic area to view the definition.
6. **Location:** The location where the activity will take place.

Press and hold the "Ctrl" key to select multiple items.

For Mac users: Press and hold the "Command" key to select multiple items.
