Dear Mr. Prasad:

Pursuant to conditions specified in a permit (see attached) issued by the City of Chicago, radiation monitoring was required to be performed at the above referenced site. AECOM, Inc. (AECOM) provided the required radiation surveillance from May 14, 2009 for the excavation of various test pits and trenches for the replacement of gas mains and connections.

Surveying was performed for the asphalt, concrete, and soil removal for the excavations required for the replacement of the gas mains and connections. The monitoring revealed no indication of soils above the specified clean-up threshold established by the U. S. Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) for the Streeterville area of Chicago. The USEPA threshold for Chicago's Streeterville area is 7.1 picocuries per gram (pCi/g total radium (Ra-226 + Ra-228)). Gamma radiation count measurements for the project were made using Ludlum Model 2221 survey meter and an unshielded 2 x 2 NaI probe (Model 44-10). Several AECOM personnel were responsible for oversight during excavation activities, which required the use of two instruments. For the two instruments used, the gamma count indicative of the 7.1 pCi/g threshold was 19,482 counts per minute (cpm) unshielded (7,402 cpm shielded) and 17,805 cpm unshielded (6,860 cpm shielded). The field gamma measurements within the excavation and the spoil materials generated during the excavation process did not exceed the respective threshold values previously stated, and ranged from a minimum of 6,400 cpm to a maximum of 11,500 cpm. Thus, there was no indication of the presence of radiologically-impacted material and/or an exceedance of the USEPA cleanup threshold of 7.1 pCi/g total radium.

2. Permit fees must be paid within 24 hours of the date of issuance. Failure to pay will result in the immediate cancellation of the permit. Monthly billing accounts are not applicable.
3. All directional boring must be pre-approved by the Office of Underground Coordination.
4. Contractor must secure plating over all openings in the roadway during non-working hours until such time when the road surface is restored.
5. All traffic control will be the responsibility of the contractor and must comply with all MUTCD standards.
6. Permitted Hours: 9 AM to 4 PM (days)
7. Restore all lanes to normal operation during non-working hours.
8. Must use flagmen and/or arrow boards to maintain traffic operations through the work zone.
9. Contractor must notify DIGGER at 312-744-7000 no less than 48 hours (exclusive of Saturdays, Sundays and Holidays) but no more than 14 calendar days in advance of the start of the excavation or demolition, unless the excavation date was provided with the application and remains unchanged. Prior to 26 calendar days the Contractor must notify DIGGER to renew the dig date!
10. It is the Excavator's responsibility to request refreshing of marks when needed, but no longer than 28 calendar days after the last requested date.
11. When applicable, all excavation areas are to be clearly marked in safety white paint prior to calling DIGGER. White paint is not required for joint meets or emergency work.
12. Excavators requesting dig tickets are responsible for the protection of utility markings at the job site. Any markings of underground utilities utilizing utility colors, must be done by facility owners or authorized agents only.
13. Use of pneumatic equipment must not begin before 8:00 A.M. or continue after 8:00 P.M.
14. Permittee must provide a sign which identifies the telephone number and company or person performing the work. Signage may be affixed to barricades.
15. Work to be performed as per plans and specifications.
16. All pavements are to be restored in accordance with CDOT Construction Standards.
17. All street openings must be restored with concrete base to grade.
18. Permanent base pavement restoration to follow within 5 days after the completion of underground work.
19. WARNING: THIS WORKSITE(S) CONTAINS RADIOACTIVE MATERIAL. ANY QUESTIONS PERTAINING TO HANDLING OF MATERIALS, CONTACT THE DEPT. OF ENVIRONMENT AT 312-744-3152.
20. No work in or use of the public right of way is to be done when a special event is taking place. It is up to the applicant to determine if an event is scheduled. To obtain a listing of programs or events within the City of Chicago please dial 311 when you are within the City boundaries.
21. It is the responsibility of the applicant to fund Traffic Control Aides if the City deems it necessary due to heavy congestion situations.

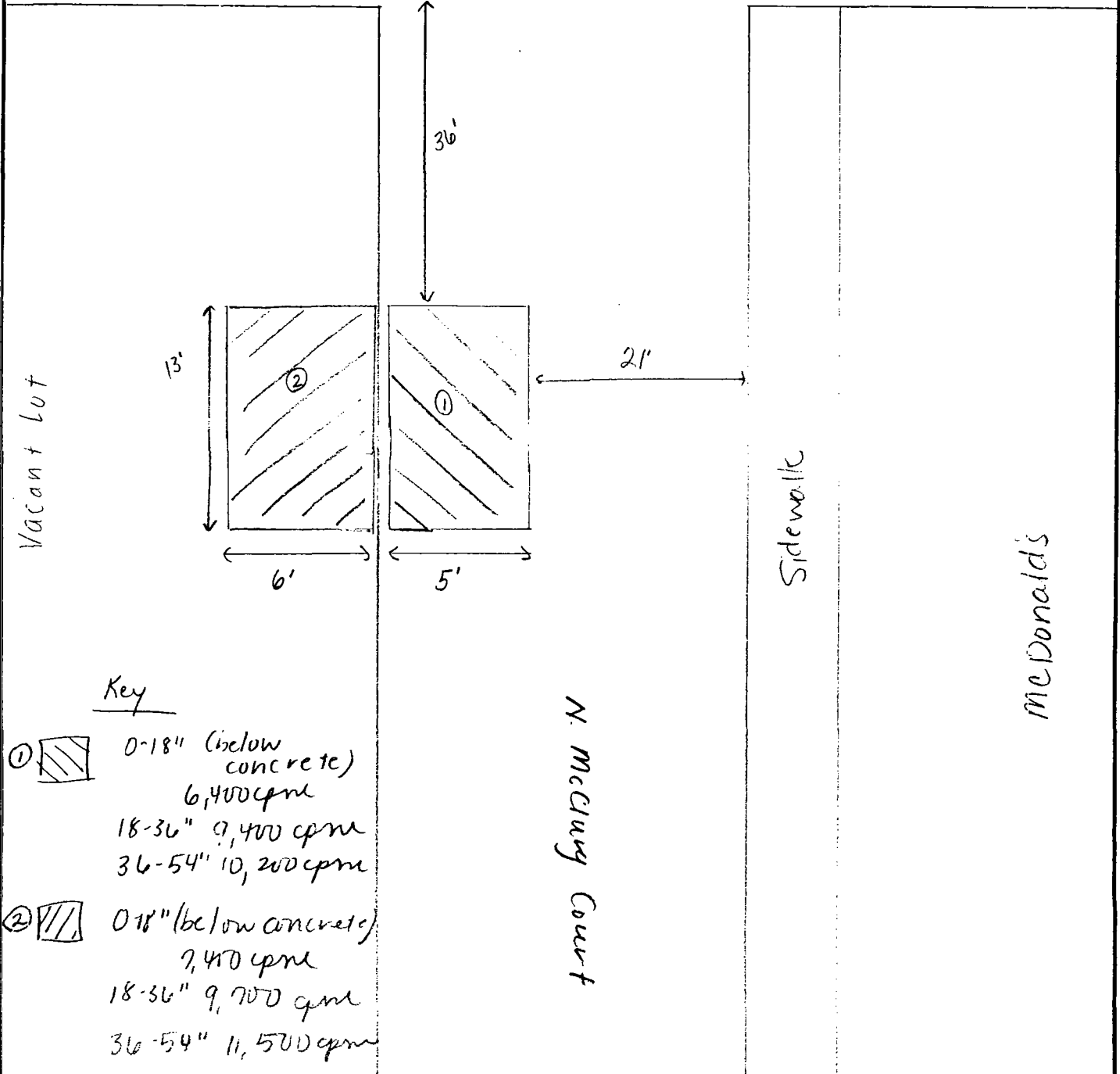
