

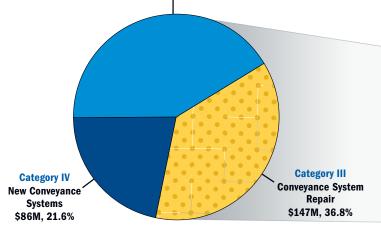
Guam

The Clean Watersheds Needs Survey (CWNS) is a comprehensive assessment of needs to meet the water quality and water-related public health goals of the Clean Water Act (CWA). States and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) conduct the CWNS every four years under CWA Section 516 (b). Guam did not participate in the 2004 survey.

CWNS 2012 Guam documented needs by category (January 2012 dollars in millions).




