


History, up to now

 - Anticipated workshop at Cowlitz Tribes in 2012


Participants in the first 3 workshops

- 1. Continue workshops and meetings of the, Intertribal Wetlands Working Group throughout the PNW,
- 2. Research and produce a Tribal Wetlands strategic plan for Tribes in EPA Region 10,
- 3. Seek training opportunities for wetlands inventory and assessment to tribal staff in the region,
- 4. Establish a governance structure, responsive to the needs of the Working Group

Outputs

- documentation of the meetings (ex. agendas, photos and statistics about attendance);
- a strategic plan that captures the state of Tribal Wetland efforts across Region 10;
- increased exposure to training opportunities for Tribal Wetlands staff;
- a organizational/governance structure that serves the Wetlands and Aquatic Resource interests of the Tribal Wetlands Working Group.

- Tribal participation and content at each workshop.
- Diversity of topics [within the CEF] and materials addressed at each workshop.
