During the workshop, participants shared that information provided by EPA Region 9 staff differed from information provided by EPA Headquarters staff at the Tribal Lands Conference on GAP Guidance issues including requirements for ETEPs. As ETEPs were being required through the GAP Guidance a previous RTOC comment was that a training be conducted in the region with headquarters staff, regional staff and tribes so that everyone has the opportunity to be on the same page. We recommend that a collaborative training be conducted to not only to help regional staff and tribes understand what headquarters is desiring out of the ETEPs, but also to inform headquarters of the practicability issues which may result for tribes and the region.
