The need for the project -

- 35 colonias in Dona Ana County, NM
 - ~ 26% of the county lives in a colonia
- Environmental hazards are common
- Many hazards are minor & can be easily corrected

Environmental health classes

Computer based programs (SPSS)

- Survey design & administration



Spreading community awareness:

Promotoras held community presentations

Provided overview of environmental issues

Explained the project



Home Safety Assessment:



- Promotora conducts first home visit
 - Completes environmental survey
 - Provides environmental health education
 - Observes home surroundings
- Second visit
 - Follow-up on recommendations
- Pre-post-tests



Topics addressed at home visit:

Electrical safety
Fire and emergencies
Hazardous household products
Outside safety hazards Food safety
Asthma and allergies
Lead

Incentives

- Smoke detector
- Fire extinguisher
- Refrigerator thermometer
- Electrical safety caps
- Cabinet safety latches
- Educational materials
