


RE: Incorporation of 40 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR)
Parts 61, 63, and 68 Regulations

Dear Mr. Walker:

Thank you for your letter dated July 10, 1995, submitting the amendment proposals for the Albuquerque/Bernalillo County Regulations Number 31 - Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants. This proposal includes a new numbering system format that is being instituted by the State of New Mexico. The proposed language submitted from the City of Albuquerque/Bernalillo County is for incorporation by reference of Federal section 112(d) Maximum Achievable Control Technologies (MACT) and other federal air toxic regulations promulgated prior to July 31, 1995.

Your request for delegation meets the requirements for the City of Albuquerque/Bernalillo County's commitment to adopt MACT's and air toxic regulations within a timely manner, as required by Title V of the Clean Air Act. The following requirements are applicable:

We have approved in 60 Federal Register (FR) 2527, January 10, 1995 the mechanism the City of Albuquerque/Bernalillo County will utilize to receive delegation for Title III requirements for major and area sources.

We appreciate the opportunity to review and comment on this regulation. After receipt of the final regulation and supporting documentation, we will prepare an FR notice of this delegation of authority for major and area sources for the section 112 hazardous air pollutant regulations listed above. We will follow the delegation procedures discussed in 40 CFR Part 63, subpart E (§ 63.91). We will continue to coordinate with the City of Albuquerque staff throughout the adoption process of incorporating Title III requirements.
