**Deadline Extended for EJ Small Grant Program** 

**EJ Small Grants** - The EJSG Program provides funding for eligible applicants for projects that address local environmental and/or public health issues within an affected community. The EJSG Program is designed to help eligible non-profit organizations, (which now includes fiscal agents) tribal governments and tribal organizations understand and address exposure to multiple environmental harms and risks. **Five Star and Urban Waters Restoration Grant Program -**EPA, the U.S. Forest Service, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, and the Corporation for National and Community Service (CNCS), FedEx, Southern Company, Bank of America, and Pacific Gas & Electric Company (PG&E) are pleased to solicit applications for the 2015 Five Star & Urban Waters **Restoration Grant Program** which is managed by the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation (NFWF). This program is part of the Urban Waters Federal Partnership which gives priority to projects located in underserved, environmentally overburdened communities.

Potential projects include the creation and restoration of wetlands; green infrastructure and stormwater management; citizen's science and volunteer water monitoring; projects that reduce or eliminate trash from entering waterways; coastal habitat, riparian, urban forest restoration and other water quality protection and restoration projects in local communities. **Recently Announced Grant Opportunities** 

#### California Department of Public Health's **Delta Mercury Exposure Reduction** Program

DPH seeks proposals to increase public awareness and understanding of fish contamination issues and reduce exposure to chemicals from eating fish caught in the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta. Sixty thousand dollars is available for this grant program to fund \$15K maximum per project for this grant cycle. Non-profit organizations or federally recognized or non-federally-recognized tribes are eligible to apply. Closes 5 pm PST, January 23, 2015 (if sent by U.S. mail, postmarked by January 23, 2015). **Community-Scale Air Toxics Ambient** Monitoring - This notice announces the availability of funds and solicits proposals for projects designed to assist state, local and tribal communities in identifying and profiling air toxics sources, assessing emerging measurement methods, characterizing the degree and extent of local air toxics problems, and tracking progress of air toxics reduction activities. Eligible applicants are air pollution control agencies and tribal governments. Environmental justice is one of ten evaluation criteria. For questions or comments, please contact Laurie Trinca. **Environmental Education Grants Program** EPA intends to issue two Requests for Proposals (RFP) under the 2014 EE Grants Program. Proposals under the **EE Model Grants** RfP are now being accepted through **February 2, 2015.** Three grants, for about \$192,200 each, will be awarded under this RFP.

Under the EE Model Grants RFP, EPA seeks grant proposals to support EE projects that promote environmental awareness and stewardship. Projects under this RFP will help provide people with the skills to take responsible actions to protect the environment. Proposals must include projects that design, demonstrate, and/or disseminate model EE practices, methods, or techniques. Each funded proposal must demonstrate replicability by locating and

jurisdiction over transportation or air quality for clean diesel projects at marine and inland water ports in areas of poor air quality. Closes 1 pm PST December 11, 2014.

P3-People, Prosperity, and the Planet - EPA's P3 program is a unique college competition that inspires solutions for a sustainable future and offers quality hands-on experience that brings classroom learning to life. In phase one, teams are awarded a \$15,000 grant to develop their idea and then compete in the National Sustainable Design Expo in Washington, DC for the P3 Award and a \$90,000 grant to turn their design into a realworld application. Closes December 16, 2014.

**Brownfields Assessment and** Cleanup - The FY2015 EPA Brownfields Assessment and Cleanup Grants quidelines were announced on October 16. Closes December 19, 2014.

### **EPA's Workforce Development and Job** Training Grant (WDJT)

This annual competition will be announced in December with applications due in January. 2015. The \$200,000 grant funding opportunity is available to local nonprofit organizations, community colleges, cities, states, tribes, and counties that create environmental training programs for unemployed and under-employed individuals that focus on comprehensive skills and certifications needed to enter full-time careers in the environmental field, including job placement and recruitment activities.

#### Interagency Refinery Task Force to Host Northern California Safety Forum on **December 11, 2014**

The California Interagency Refinery Task Force will host a Refinery Safety Forum on December 11, from 6pm to 8 pm PST in Richmond. This is the first of a series of forums to provide information and promote dialogue on worker and community safety. The two hour forum offers an opportunity for the public to obtain facts and insight, ask questions, and discuss how refinery operations impact the community. Translators will be available to translate in Spanish and Lao. The forum will be held at the Richmond City Council Chambers, 440 Civic Center Plaza, Richmond, California, 94804. Participating and planning organizations include local, state, and federal agencies; labor and contractor organizations; refineries; academia; and community and environmental groups. Topics to be covered include emergency warning and notification systems; air

monitoring systems; and transportation of petroleum by rail and other means.
