

Re: Utah Area Designation Recommendations for the 2010 NO₂ NAAQS

On February 9, 2010, EPA promulgated revised Primary National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS) for Nitrogen Dioxide (NO₂). Section 107(d) of the Clean Air Act establishes that it is incumbent on each state to recommend initial designations for all areas within its respective geographical boundary within one year following the date of promulgation of a new or revised standard.

Data collected along the Wasatch Front indicate that NO₂ levels are well below both the one hour NAAQS of 100 ppb and the annual NAAQS of 53 ppb. The table below shows the current NO₂ levels in the State of Utah in relation to the 1-hour and the annual average NO₂ primary standards.
