## WHAT ARE RECYCLABLES?



- Raw materials
- Compete with other raw materials
- Commodities with fluctuating value

## SECONDARY VS. VIRGIN







- Predictability of quantity
- Predictability of quality

## EREF STUDY ON PRICE VOLATILITY OF RECYCLABLES



- More volatile than commodities studied
- Paper had the most volatility

## SUPPLY & DEMAND



- You don't sell scrap, someone buys it
- Can't turn off the spigot anymore

## **GOALS:**



- Aspirational not realistic
- Long-term strategies
- Beware of aggressive reporting

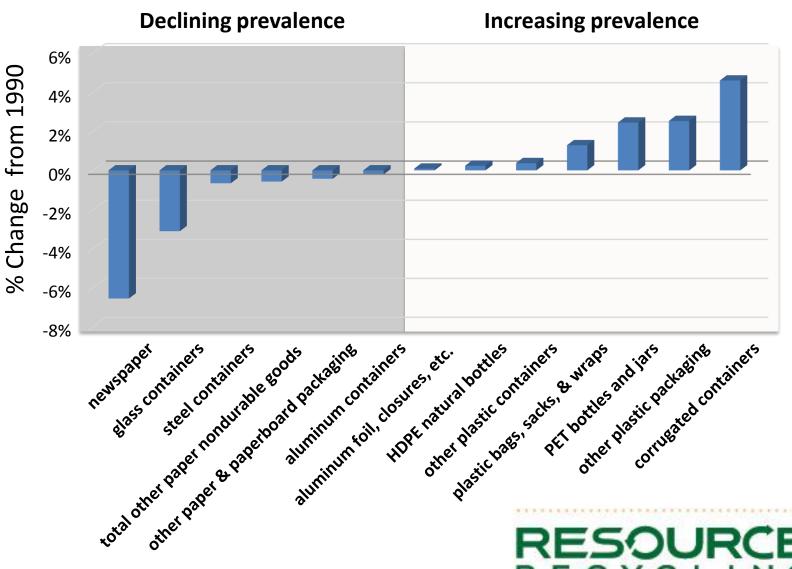

## PAPER: 2000 - 2013



- 19,140,000 ton loss
- 22% decrease
- Mostly printed paper
- Online shopping

## PLASTIC: 2000 - 2013



- 6,960,000 ton gain
- 27% increase
- Packaging is 43%
- Durables on the rise

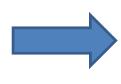

## **Market Drivers Fueling the Shift**

- Brand differentiation in an increasingly competitive environment
- Customers preference
  - Convenience is king
  - "On-the-go" lifestyles among increasingly time poor consumers
  - Trend of smaller, single-serving sizes
- Performance is key
  - Highly technical
  - Logistical advantages
  - "Doesn't matter if it's sustainable if it doesn't perform"

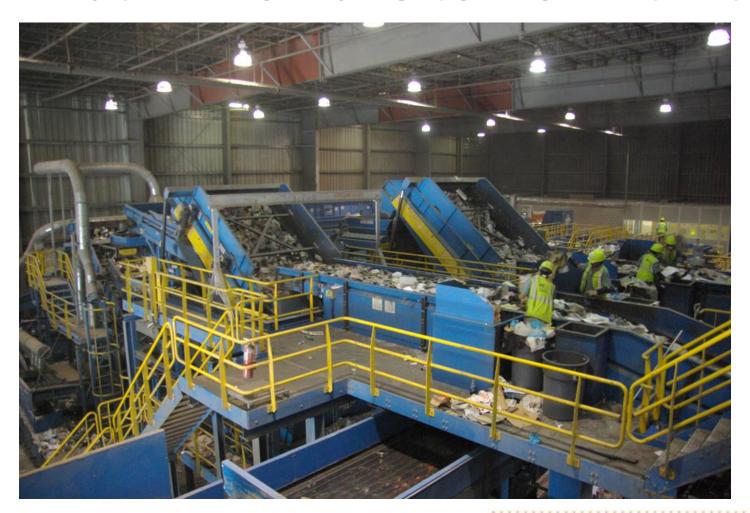

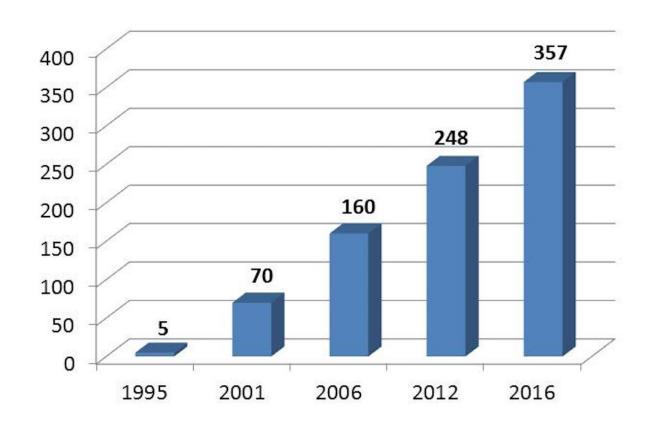


#### What MRFs Have to Do With It

- Quality matters
- Single-stream MRFs the standard
- Many designed and built before/for "old" material mix

#### From Processors to Reclaimers

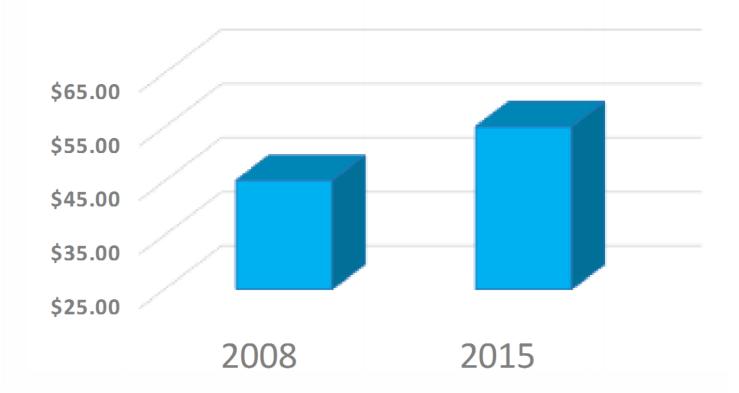
- ...And from MRFs and PRFs to markets

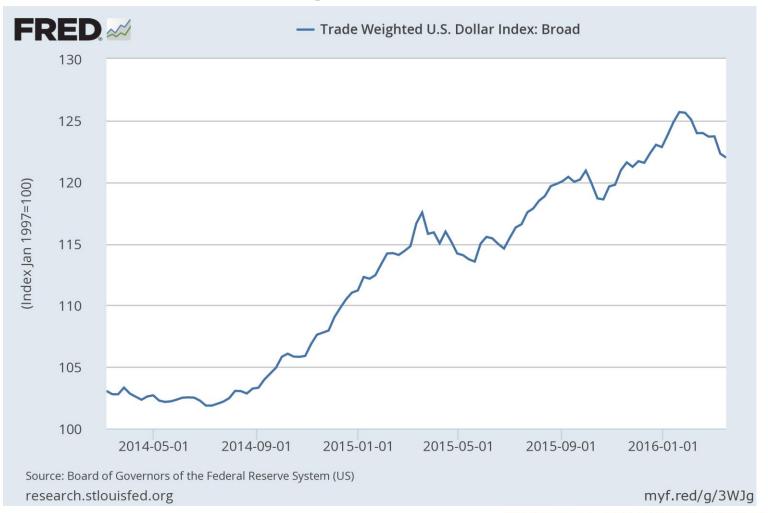


## The Big Picture

- = Down market, disappearing margins, hurting industry



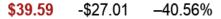

#### Crude oil (barrel)



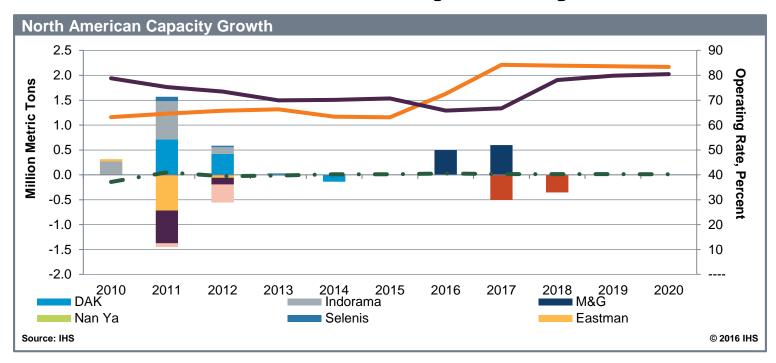

## **Excess Capacity**

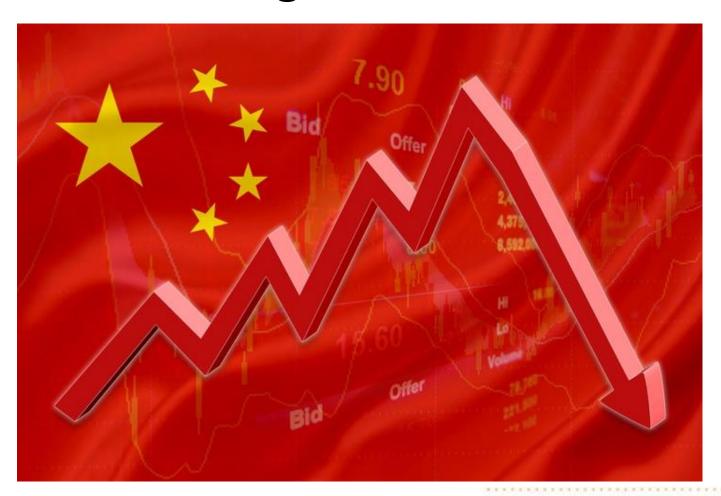


US containerboard stocks at 11-year high in February but now on seasonal downhill slope -- mills run at 95%

OAKLAND, CA, March 18, 2016 (PPI Pulp & Paper Week) - US corrugated box shipments showed modest growth in February and containerboard inventories dropped by 61,000 tons after their big surge in January.

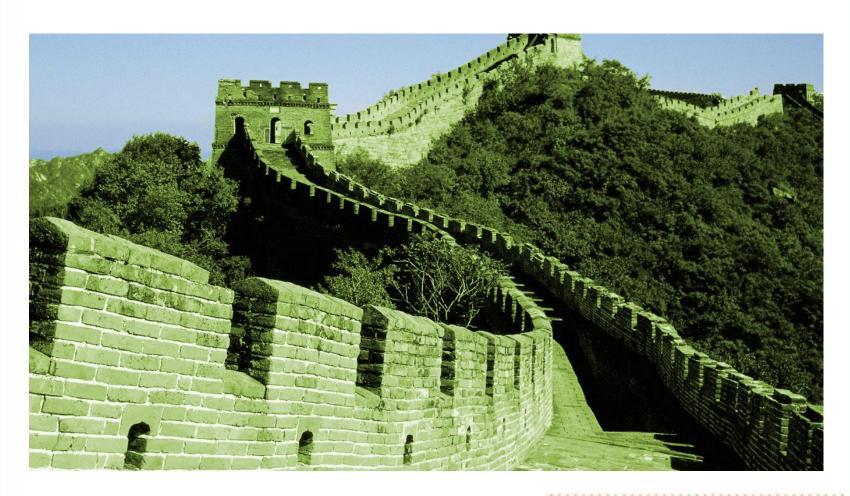

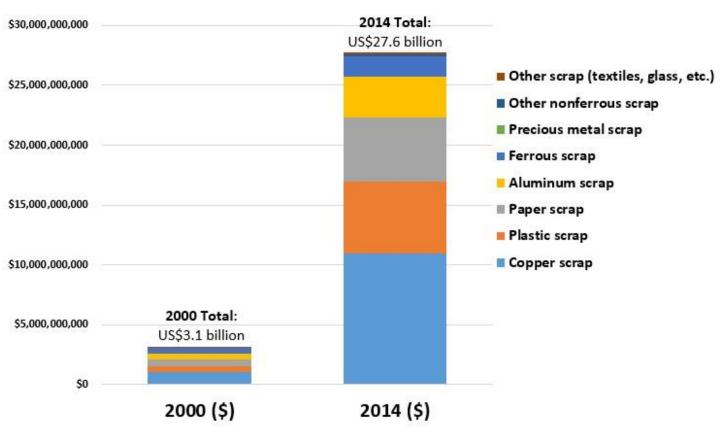

#### Value of Chinese Scrap Imports from All Origins (US\$)

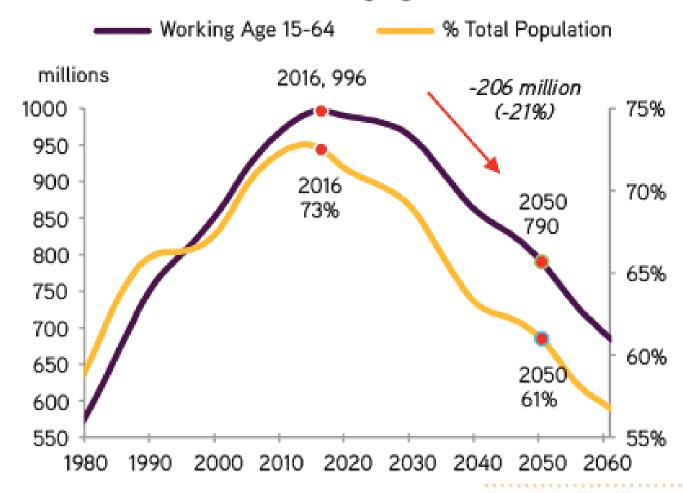

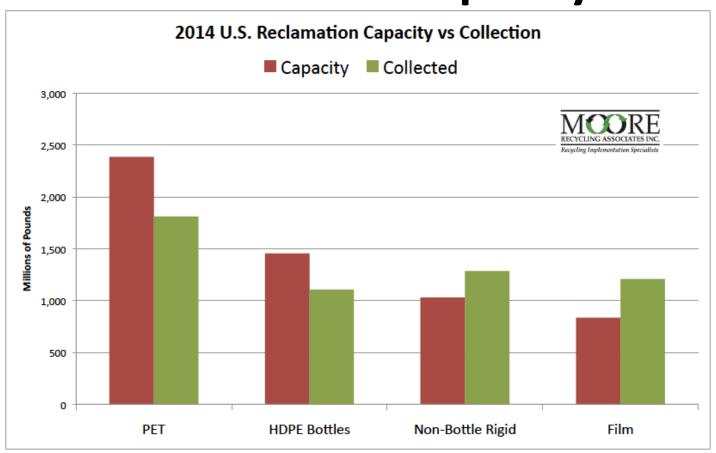

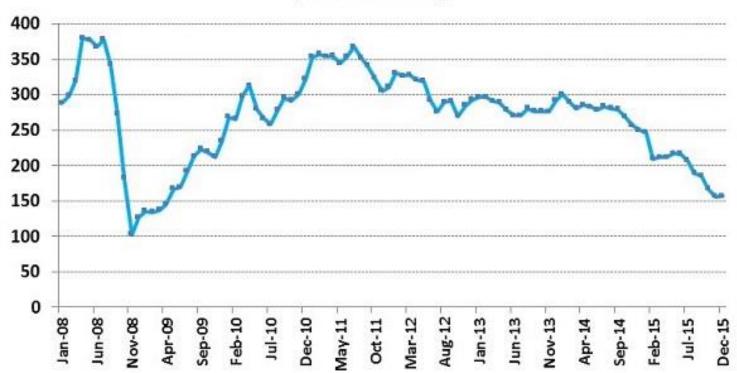




# **Aggregate Scrap Material Values**

ISRI Index: Jan 2008 - Dec 2015

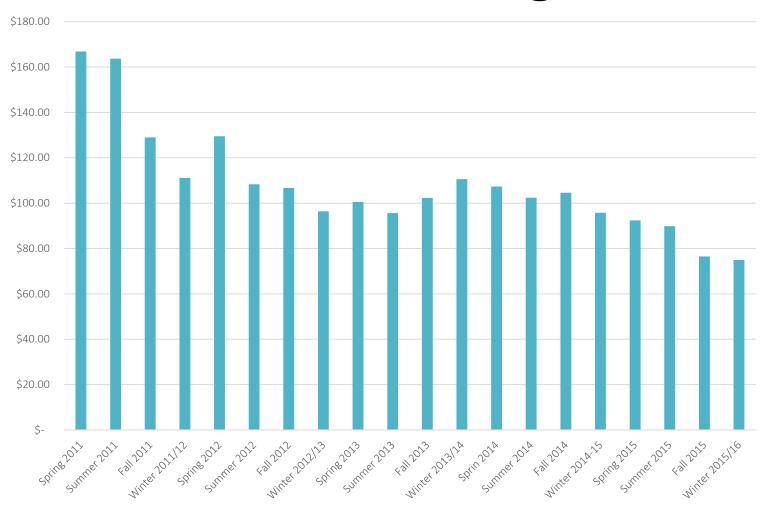

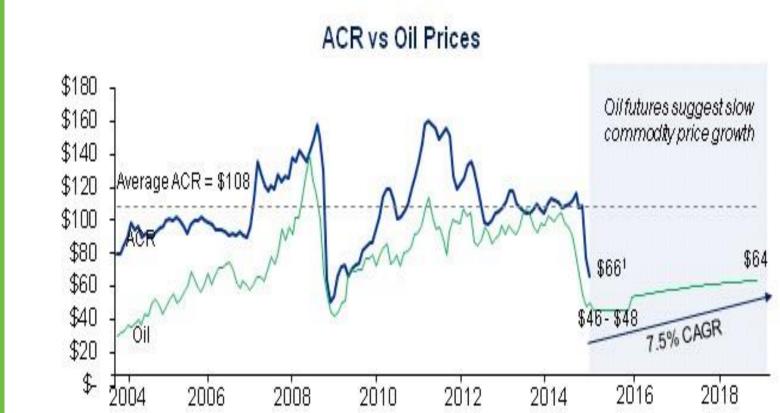
# OIL PRICES & RECYCLABLES: RECOMMUNITY

- Clear definitions
- Contamination levels
- Residue levels
- Processing fees
- Revenue sharing
- Input audits
- Education

# PROCESSING CHARGES



- Handling Fee for fully rejected load which the customer removes?
- Add disposal fee if the customer does not remove?
- Handling Fee for excess contaminated single stream?
- Downgrade contaminated OCC from commercial sources?
