# Exchange Network/E-Enterprise Governance and Tribal Consultation

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### Tribal Governance Group

- The EN TGG is an ad-hoc group that was formed to address tribal issues regarding the EPA Exchange Network
- NCAI/ITEP Tribal EN Cooperative Agreement recipients
- Members have a wide variety of technical skills needed to communicate with state & EPA technical staff

### **Exchange Network Timeline**

- 2002 Implementation Plan for Exchange Network / Exchange Network grant funding available
- 2006 Charter for (2) Exchange Network Leadership Council and the (2) Network Board Operations
- <u>2011</u> Action Plan for completing Phase 1 of EN: 10 priority data flows
- 2013 Exchange Network Leadership Council (ENLC)
  adopts Implementation for phase 2 of the EN; ENLC (2),
  ENLC Coordination Team (0), Network Technology Board
  (2)
- 2015 Exchange Network governance becomes part of E-Enterprise
- <u>2016</u> EELC draft charter outlines new governance

### **Exchange Network**


- EN developed by states/EPA as a way to come up with standards and protocols for sharing/submitting environmental data (EPA-OEI)
- ECOS is responsible for the day to day operations of the Exchange Network; ECOS staff and EN Coordinator under contract with ECOS
- EPA Data Exchanges use the Exchange Network;
  Central Data Exchange (CDX)
  - Tribal Data → Fit Data into Data Exchange Template (DET)
    Schema → Generate .xml file → Use Node/Node Client to submit data → Validation of file → Results accepted

### E-Enterprise

- 2012 ECOS and EPA issue a joint statement regarding the EPA/ECOS E-Enterprise initiative
- 2013/2014 States and EPA joint working groups develop the conceptual blueprint and design /implementation strategy
- E-Enterprise for the environment meant to modernize how government agencies deliver environmental protection (EPA-OCFO)
- E-Enterprise first presented to tribes at the Tribal EN Conference in February 2015

## **EN/EE Joint Governance Model**

- EELC Draft Charter (March revision)
- Exchange Network and E-Enterprise as one



#### **EN Tribal Issues**

- Communication issues with the various EPA offices
  - EPA-OEI, Office of Information Collection (OIC), Office of Information Analysis and Access (OIAA) – Tribal Program Coordinator
  - EPA-OCFO
  - EPA-OITA
- EN Tribal participation is low and tribal EN grant applicants continue to decline

#### **EN Tribal Issues**

- Tribes at different levels of technology & infrastructure
  - Hard to streamline tribes in an enterprise
  - How many tribes actually have data management systems in place
- EELC Draft Charter
  - Referred to tribal participants as co-regulators
  - Unequal representation and tribes should be able to choose their representatives

#### **TGG Actions**

- Concerns about EELC Charter
  - Tribal Participation, etc.
- Sept 2015, TGG concerns expressed to EPA-OEI Matt Leopard & Ann Dunkin
- <u>Feb 2016</u>, TGG concerns expressed to EPA-OITA JoAnn Chase & Randy Hill
- March 2016, TGG Letter to Exchange Network Leadership
  - Response from ECOS and EPA leadership

#### **Tribal Consultation**

- Initiated March 9, 2016
- EELC charter refers to <u>GOVERNANCE!</u> not participating
- Both March 30 & 31 webinar opportunities did not have large tribal participation
- E-enterprise for the environment is still a new concept to many tribes and those on the webinar still had questions
- April 14, 2016 is end of the comment period

## TGG, NTC, & NCAI

- As part of the new EELC governance model, each entity is working together to develop a process to nominate and select tribal representatives for all levels of EELC governance
- Striving for equal regional representation
- Establishing new working relationships with EPA offices/staff and the Exchange Network/E-Enterprise governance as well as NTC and NCAI
