Upon consultation with our Compliance and Enforcement Division, I will contact you if I need additional information. Just FYI, before EPA can issue any permit, we will need to do an evaluation of:

Endangered Species Act (ESA) Section 7(a)(2) states that each Federal agency shall, in consultation with the
Secretary, insure that any action they authorize, fund, or carry out is not likely to jeopardize the continued
existence of a listed species or result in the destruction or adverse modification of designated critical
habitat. This section of the Act defines the consultation process, which is further developed in regulations
promulgated at 50 CFR §402."

And

• The National Historic Prevention Act (NHPA- Section 106) of 1966 requires EPA to ensure historic properties are considered during Federal project planning and execution, that requires EPA to "take into account" how each of its undertaking could affect historic properties which includes issuance of permits by EPA.

I understand that this is an existing operation, however an evaluation is needed. Therefore if you have had any permits issued for water or even have undergone a "NEPA" review for this facility, I will be happy to review and use that analyses for this permit. Otherwise we will need additional information of the location and ESA or biological analyses for this site.
