


January 2016: Groundbreaking for Hurley Water Phase VI: DMME's funding contribution was \$1,000,000




March 2015: Groundbreaking for Hurley Water Phase V. DMME contributed \$4.75 million

Total Cost - \$131,338,715.76




Over 8700 water supplies replaced or enhanced with funding from the coal industry


