Attached is Maryland Department of the Environment's (MDE) recommendation to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency of the list of sulfur dioxide sources in Maryland subject to the "Data Requirements Rule for the 2010 1-Hour Sulfur Dioxide (SO₂) Primary National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS)," (80 Fed. Reg. 51087). Consistent with the rule, the Department has included on the list those SO₂ emissions sources for which the state will be required to submit further air quality characterization. This includes sources having annual actual SO₂ emissions of 2,000 tons or more or, in the case of the C.P. Crane plant, having nearly 2,000 tons per year of emissions and being located close to other large sources.
