BURN PERMIT PROCESS

 Submit a permit application at least one business day before you want to burn.
 Call 541-429-7080, 541-429-7421 or 541-429-7422 each day you want to burn to find out if it is a burn day.
 Burn only on BURN DAYS and ONLY DURING ALLOWED HOURS.

3. If it is a Burn Day and you are going to burn, stay on the line and <u>leave a</u> <u>complete message with your name,</u> <u>permit number, phone number and</u> <u>what you are burning that day.</u> Your permit application is not complete until you have left this message.

4. Each time you burn, record information in the log to the right. \rightarrow

5. Burner must be prepared to prevent and extinguish escaped burns.



Smoke impacts on public roads, schools, daycares, medical facilities, elder homes and other sensitive people or areas must be prevented as a condition of this permit. Burning is not permitted during burn bans or air pollution episodes, or when the CTUIR Office of Air Quality or EPA determines that burning will cause an adverse impact to air quality. This permit is part of a federal air quality program administered by the CTUIR to control emissions of air pollutants and manage smoke for air quality purposes. These rules apply to any person within the exterior boundaries of the 1855 Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla Indian reservation.

The public reporting and recordkeeping burden for this collection of information is estimated to average 0.10 hour per response. Q: Why do I need a permit? A: Smoke from open burning is an air pollutant with effects on air quality and public health (especially for children and the elderly).

Q: What are some alternatives to outdoor burning?

A: Chipping and shredding vegetation for composting. Also, household items such as glass, plastics and paper can be recycled and should not be burned.

Q: How can I burn more cleanly? A: Make sure your fuel is as dry as possible, separate the fire from damp ground and be sure there is enough draft to keep the fire burning hot.

Q: Are there exceptions?

A: Cultural, traditional and recreational fires are exempt and do not require a permit.
