Finding EPA Competitive Opportunities on Grants.gov

- Find current competitive opportunities
 - Synopses includes important info: funding amounts, eligible entities, submission deadline, and more
- Searchable by CFDA, keyword, agency, type of entity, etc
- Sign up for Automatic notifications of opportunities

Applying on Grants.gov

- Apply online using Grants.gov (required for initial application)
 - Must Register Obtain DUNs, register with SAM, Setup Username/password, authorization
 - Ensure when you apply for an opportunity that the DUNS you use is assigned to your organization – if it isn't you may be deemed ineligible



Applying on Grants.gov Workspace

- Currently two ways of applying
 - Legacy PDF Application Package
 - Workspace
- December 2017: Workspace will be the only method of submitting an application
 - Reuse forms & auto-populate data
 - Detect errors earlier
 - Best submission process for users with connectivity issues





The goal of the RP2INC program is to fund an organization which will serve as the national coordinator of the regional P2 Resource Exchange Centers. The national coordinator will provide leadership in: framing national P2 initiatives, strengthening collaboration among the regional centers, evaluating P2 information, tools and products, and marketing the centers' services nationally.

For purposes of the grant programs, P2 is defined as any practice which reduces or eliminates the creation of pollutants through; increased efficiency in the use of raw materials, energy,

Uses and Use Restrictions (070):

EPA is interested in supporting pollution prevention, source reduction and resource conservation projects that will provide an overall benefit to the environment by preventing pollutants at the source. Source reduction projects can include but are not limited to: 1) improving facility and institutional operations that reduce pollutant use and exposure, 2) reformulating and procuring products to reduce toxic constituents, 3) providing direct technical assistance to businesses and other organizations, 4) encouraging green product design and manufacturing, 5) conducting outreach, 6) collecting and analyzing data, and 7) integrating pollution prevention concepts into state, regional and tribal environmental multimedia programs. Grant activities must be consistent with the grant guidelines of the statutory authorities listed for this program. The statutory authorities are listed in this CFDA announcement and in the applicable grant solicitations. The statutes authorize EPA to award assistance agreements to support the following activities: "research, investigations, experiments, education/training, demonstrations of new or innovative techniques, surveys and studies." These activities relate generally to the gathering or transferring of information or advancing the state of knowledge. Grant proposals should emphasize this "learning" concept, as opposed to "fixing" an environmental problem via a well-established method. For example, a proposal to install a more energy efficient heating system in the applicant's facility in order to conserve energy, would not, in itself fall within research, studies, demonstrations, etc. All activities in the applicant's proposal must be eligible under one or more of the statutory authorities listed.

Grant recipients and sub-recipients are encouraged to adopt and enforce policies that ban text messaging while driving company-owned or -rented vehicles or government-owned vehicles, or while driving privately-owned vehicles when on official government business or when performing any work for or on behalf of the government. Grant recipients and sub-recipients are encouraged to conduct initiatives of the type described in section 3(a) of the Federal Leadership on Reducing Text Messaging While Driving Executive Order that was signed on October 1, 2009.

- Each funding opportunity announcement has unique instructions and requirements
- Read the announcement for:
 - Eligibility information, deadlines, proposal content, review criteria, and more
- EPA's Competition Policy

 - Familiarize yourself with EPA's policy on competition

Types of Announcements

- Request for Proposals (RFP)
 - Abbreviated application: workplan and a few forms
- Request for Initial Proposals (RFIP)
 - 2 Phases: (1) EPA receives initial proposals
 - (2) EPA requests full proposals from highest ranking applicants
- Request for Application (RFA)
 - Submission includes all forms and certifications necessary for award

Announcement Content/Highlights

- Section II
 - expected number of awards
 - expected funding amount
- Section III
 - list of eligible entities
 - Cost share/matching requirements if any
 - Threshold eligibility criteria:

may include legal, policy, relevance, programmatic, administrative, and/or financial criteria that have the effect of making an applicant, proposal/application, or project eligible or ineligible for award

- Section IV
 - Content and form of application
 - Address Section I (program info), Section III (threshold criteria) and Section V (evaluation criteria)
 - Submission method (electronically thru grants.gov is required for initial applications)
 - Submission dates and times
 - Pay attention to deadlines and page limits
 - Administrative and national policy requirements

- Section V
 - Ranking criteria
 - Criteria used to evaluate proposals
 - Must address ranking criteria in proposals such as
 - Programmatic Capability
 - Past Performance under grants
 - Environmental Results-plan for measuring progress towards achieving outputs/outcomes
 - Timely Expenditure of Grant Funds
 - Budget and Leveraging
 - Technical approach
 - Other factors (in some announcements)
 - Review and selection process

Modifications

- EPA occasionally modifies announcements
 - Due dates, clarification of requirements, etc
- Automatic Notification
 - Sign up on grants.gov for automatic notification of modifications to specific announcements
 - Modifications posted on grants.gov

Communications with Applicants

- See Section 11 of the Competition Policy https://www.epa.gov/grants/epa-order-57005a1-epas-policy-competition-assistance-agreements
- Limitations on what can be discussed and when
- Pre-proposal Assistance
 - Many programs will post Q&As on a website
 - Some programs offer conference calls/webinars where applicants can ask questions
 - This type of information is usually in Section IV or VII of announcements, if applicable

Communications with Applicants

• EPA can:

- Answer applicant eligibility questions-if uncertain if you are eligible or your project is eligible ask before proposal submission
- Clarify info on administrative aspects of proposal submission
- Respond to requests for clarification of the announcement
- NOTE: Clarifications that result in changes to the announcement must be communicated (via modification to the announcement) to all potential applicants

Communications with Applicants

- EPA cannot:
 - Offer to write proposals for applicants
 - Review or comment on draft proposals
 - Provide information on the Agency's approach to evaluating proposals beyond what is described in Section V of the announcement
 - Provide a competitive advantage to any applicant

Competitive Process

- 1. EPA prepares announcement
- EPA posts announcement on program office website and grants.gov
- 3. EPA receives applications/proposals from applicants
- 4. EPA evaluates proposals and makes selections
- 5. Issues awards
 - Note: Award Official will check the Federal Awardee Performance and Integrity Information System (FAPIIS) prior to award to ensure applicant is qualified (see 2 CFR 200.205)
