On behalf of Governor Rauner, and pursuant to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's revision to the National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS) for ozone dated October 26, 2015, I am submitting our recommendations for attainment and nonattainment designations for the State of Illinois. Included with Illinois' recommendations is a supporting document prepared by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (Illinois EPA). The Illinois EPA will also provide this document to your staff in electronic format to facilitate your timely review.

We are recommending that the portions of the Chicago and Metro-East St. Louis metropolitan areas described above be designated as nonattainment for the 2015 ozone NAAQS, as violations of the revised ozone standard have been measured in these areas during 2013-2015. The remainder of Illinois is attaining the revised ozone standard and should, therefore, be designated as unclassifiable/attainment. The recommended nonattainment boundaries are the same as the boundaries established pursuant to the 2008 ozone NAAQS.
