




- Vision set by community leaders

EJ success needs collaboration







- Regular trash service being pursued
- Humanitarian efforts to add health screenings and senior citizen care
- Community gardens with branded produce





- Rehabilitate existing homes
 - Floodplain regulations/restrictions-Dallas County concerns about NFIP participation
- Investigate ways to protect low property taxes
- Protect the community's desire to not be involuntarily relocated



- Keys to Success:
