Protecting Maine's Air, Land and Water

Maine's CWSRF Program

- Single Project Priority Ranking Process and List
 - No separate process for stormwater projects
 - Environmental Ranking considering:
 - Water Supply Protection
 - Lakes Protection
 - Shellfishery Protection
 - Water Quality Concern
 - Facility Needs
 - Additional points awarded for "Green" projects which encompasses a number of stormwater projects
- Climate Adaptation Plans, up to \$20,000 in loan forgiveness

CWSRF Stormwater Eligibility

Water Resources Reform and Development Act of 2014 (WRRDA)

- *"for measures to manage, reduce, treat, or recapture stormwater or subsurface drainage water;"*
 - E.g., green roofs, rain gardens, roadside planting, porous pavement, rainwater harvesting, etc.
- *"for reusing or recycling wastewater, stormwater, or subsurface drainage water;"*
 - E.g., reuse equipment and distribution systems on private property

Above eligibilities no longer require some form of treatment and recipients may be either public or private entities.
