Transparency, Participation and Collaboration Actions/Opportunities:

- Over the past quarter EPA offered many ways for the public to get informed and involved including:
 - Released searchable website for Drinking Water Violations; EPA to host webinar to show how to use the public health data
 - Published Map of 2009 Enforcement Actions where the public can view raw data in XML or HTML format
 - Published America's Children and the Environment, which brings together, in one place, quantitative information from a variety of sources to show trends in levels of environmental contaminants in air, water, food, and soil; concentrations of contaminants measured in the bodies of mothers and children; and childhood diseases that may be influenced by environmental factors
 - Removed Confidentiality Claims for More Than 150 Chemicals as part of continuing effort to protect Americans' health by increasing access to chemical information
 - Established National Tribal Toxics Committee to address risks from toxic chemicals
 - Launched Apps for the Environment challenge for software developers to create an application that puts environmental and public health information at citizens' fingertips
 - Launched Energy Star Video Challenge to show easy ways to save energy and money
 - Chaired the North America Commission for Environmental Cooperation Joint partnership among
 U.S., Canada and Mexico to strengthen cooperation on health and environmental protection
 - Awarded grant to help reduce E-waste to further commitment to responsible electronic stewardship
 - Hosted 12 public listening sessions during National Ocean Month
 - Posted 13 transcripts from Administrator Jackson
 - Posted 7 testimonies from Congressional hearings
