Part II. Self-Assessment

The City of Peabody has completed the required self-assessment and has determined that our municipality is in compliance with all permit conditions. The City's Department of Public Services is responsible for implementation of measurable goals. It is anticipated that progress will be made as municipal budgets improve in FY07 and beyond.

Peabody has an extensive household hazardous waste program. Besides a once a year dropoff, we collect waste oil, car batteries, propane tanks, computer monitors, refrigerators, televisions, computer units, air conditioners, and yard waste at all times throughout the year. From this program, we properly manage a number of toxic substances and enhance protection of stormwater quality. We also collect leaves curbside 12 weeks/year and provide drop off yard waste at all times throughout the year.

When weather permits, we sweep streets in the winter to remove sediment, thus improving runoff water quality. We also clean about 2500 catch basin (of our 4500 total) to ensure water quality is met.

We also have minimized or eliminated the generation of hazardous waste at our DPW facilities to eliminate environmental impacts. Our vehicles are stored inside and are highly maintained, reducing leaks of fuel, hydraulic fluids, and other maintenance related toxic materials.
