The Air Resources Board (ARB) has been notified by the Bay Area Air Quality Management District (District) that it has compiled three years (2001-2003) of ozone monitoring data without violations of the national one-hour ozone standard and that a finding of attainment would be appropriate (see attachment). We concur with the District and request that the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency proceed expeditiously to make a finding of attainment.

We are encouraged by the District's statements of commitment to continue taking actions that reduce of ozone precursor emissions. We will fully support the District in those efforts, as such actions help to ensure progress toward attaining the national 8-hour ozone standard in the Bay Area and downwind areas, the more protective State ozone standards, and the national PM2.5 standards.
