Goal & Objectives



Goal

1. At least one community in each State has a vision statement and at least 4 communities in Babeldaab have begun to incorporate that vision statement into **land use and/or management plans** that meet their economic and environmental needs.

Objectives

1. By 2007 communities will have an increased understanding of the threats and ecology of their landscape, as well as an understanding of their role and the roles of various management agencies in environmental management.
2. By 2007 10 Communities will have Vision Statements that feed into an agreed vision for the long-term sustainable future of Babeldaab.
3. By 2007 at least 4 communities will have access to detailed information on land use planning methods, critical sites for protection, best management practices, and resource assessments.
4. By 2007 at least 4 communities have begun sustainable land use planning.
