

Guam EPA 401 Water Quality Certification

- Section 401 of the Federal Clean Water Act provides that an applicant for a Federal Permit to conduct an activity that may result in a discharge to waters of the Territory must provide the permitting agency with a water quality certification from which the discharge originates.
- A water quality certification is the mechanism by which the Territory evaluates whether an activity may proceed and meet water quality standards







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- Section 33 U.S.C. 1341 et seq., § 401 of the Clean Water Act is a direct delegation from congress to the Territory's.
- In doing this, Congress wanted to ensure that the Territory has an opportunity to ensure that federally approved activities will meet water quality standards established by the Territory under the Clean Water Act.
- In Guam, the Guam Environmental Protection Agency (GEPA) is the designated agency for issuing certifications.

Guam EPA 401 Water Quality Certification

Regulatory Summary:

- The 401 Water Quality Certification Program is administered by the Environmental Planning and Review Division of the GEPA.

 The 401 review ensures that a proposed discharge, dredge and/or fill project that can result in discharge of pollutants complies with Guam Water Quality Standards, the Wet Area regulations under the Land Use Commission,
 - and otherwise avoids or minimizes individual and cumulative impacts to Guam waters and wetlands.

Guam EPA 401 Water Quality Certification

Regulatory Summary Cont:

As the authority to administer the 401 Water Quality Certification is derived from the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, all projects that impacts Guam waters (Marine or Surface) are subject to 401 review.




